Mawuli School – Marching Forward with Purpose After the 75th Anniversary

It is important to note with excitement and exhilaration that this congress comes right after the iconic 75th anniversary celebrations of Mawuli School. I proudly stand on behalf of the OMSU-NA Executive Council and Board of Directors to wish everybody very fruitful deliberations at the Congress. We also thank all those who through honoring their membership obligations by paying dues, donations, and levies, and sympathizers who through their generous donations, have supported the on-going programs and projects of OMSU-NA at Mawuli School. We salute all other OMSU branches and year groups throughout the world that are engaged on programs and efforts of repositioning Mawuli School towards its centenary in some number of years to come. We congratulate all Mawulians and sympathizers and their families who have achieved important milestones in their careers and other endeavors. We also take this opportunity to express our best wishes to all those who have had pleasant life changing events in their lives, such as graduations, engagements, marriages, or childbirth. All those who have had to deal with illnesses or some sort of distress in the family are in our thoughts and prayers. Thoughts of all our colleagues, mates, friends, family members, and others who have departed from our midst would remain in our loving and fond memories.

After the 75th anniversary celebration, OMSU-NA resolves to keep marching full steam ahead in restoring Mawuli School academically and aesthetically in association with all our compatriots. It is our determination to help, in diverse and decisive ways, in solving the problems of Mawuli School through membership dues and donations and on this note we invite and encourage all Mawulians and sympathizers of Mawuli School, who are not yet members, to join our organization as active members as we continue in this noble journey and grand odyssey. We must report that we recently donated funds to support training of the Mawuli School National Math and Science Quiz competition team. We teamed up with the Class of 1990 to recently renovate Corridor 3 in preparation for the 75th anniversary celebrations. Also, in preparation for the 75th anniversary, we revamped the driving space between the old dining hall and old administration block and painted the old dining hall in the school colors. Very recently, we donated funds to the school to support the Tutoring Program for Final Years preparing for the forthcoming WASSCE examinations. We're currently in discussions with the Mawuli School Headmaster, Mr. Benjamin Dei, to replace all the non-functioning computers and accessories in the OMSU-NA funded and built computer lab.

Essentially, taking stock of OMSU-NA's activities on the Mawuli School campus since year 2002 when our organization was reorganized, the following programs and projects that are focused on impacting student learning and progress, in addition to enhancing teaching at the school have been undertaken and completed by OMSU-NA: 1) Donation of two (2) Large Photocopiers (Sharp), 2) Rehabilitation of the 6-Unit White Block including Replacement of all windows and painting, 3) Donation of 15 PCs (personal computers) and 15 Monitors, on one occasion, 4) Donation of 16 PC (personal computers) and 8 Monitors, on another occasion, 5) Sponsorship of the former Board Chairman, Justice N. Gbadegbe, to our OMSU-NA Congress held in Chicago in 2003 (this was directly underwritten by some dedicated members of OMSU-NA), 6) Donation of Boxes of Assorted Medications through the hard work of one of our dedicated medical doctors, 7) Donation of 1 Panasonic Fax Machine, 8) Creation of the OMSU website (this site is maintained and paid for by OMSU-NA on behalf of all OMSU Chapters worldwide (OMSU-UK, OMSU-Ghana, and all other OMSU-Chapters and year groups are invited and encouraged to send all information on their activities so they can be placed at the site), 9) Rehabilitation of the School Clinic (Sick Bay), 10) Rehabilitation of the 14-Unit Long Block including repainting after several years since the first painting was done, 11) Funding of Teaching Excellence Workshops at the school in collaboration with OMSU-UK, 12) Donation of Microscopes, 13) Total rehabilitation of the entire Aku House that facilitated its reversion to a dorm to ease the congestion in the boys' dormitories, 14) Support for an Incentive Scheme for Teachers, 15) Running of a Career Awareness and Academic Excellence Workshop for students led by OMSU-NA representatives during the 60th anniversary celebrations, 16) Rehabilitation and face-lift of Corridor 3 that has turned it into a state-of-the-art gateway to the main campus, 17) Thorough renovation of the Headmaster's house that included replacement of kitchen and bathroom fixtures and painting of the entire residence in 2010, 18) Sponsorship of three key officials who oversee the affairs of Mawuli School to our 2010 Congress in Washington D. C. (these officials were the School Board Chair, the headmaster, and the Volta Regional Director of Education), 19) Sponsorship of one of the dedicated teachers of Mawuli School, Ms. Edem Djanie, to our 2012 Congress held in Chicago, 20) Donation of books, 21) Donation of badly-needed classroom chairs, 22) Donation of another batch of computers that were set up in the

remodeled computer lab, 23) Remodeling and completion of the old home science lab into an ultra-modern computer lab. This project was a continuation of the Corridor 3 and Adjoining Areas Rehabilitation and Face-lift Project that began with the remodeling of Corridor 3, 24) Procurement and shipment of 50 Dell OptiPlex CPUs, 5 Dell PowerEdge Servers, 100 Dell LCD Flat Screen Monitors, a Large HP Color Copier, Printer, and Fax Machine, another Large Multifunction Printer, and a number of computer cables and other accessories that arrived in Ghana and were installed in the remodeled computer lab, 25) Donation of a cash amount of \$2,500 to support the Mawuli School team that prepared to participate in the National Math and Science Quiz competition in 2018, 26) Donation of funds to support Mawuli School participation in the 2019 National Math and Science Quiz competition, 27) Donation of a cash amount of \$5,600 to support the 2019 Mawuli School Tutoring Program for the final year students of the school, included in this amount is \$500 in support of the honors day activities and \$100 towards supporting the female winner of the Solace Lotsu Prize in biology, we recently also donated an amount of \$5,000 in support of the Tutoring Program of 2024 as mentioned earlier, 28) Donation of funds to support Mawuli School participation in the 2024 National Math and Science Quiz competition, 29) Painting and refurbishment of Corridor 3 in preparation for the 75th, as mentioned earlier, 30) Restoration of the driving space between the old dining hall and old administration block, as mentioned earlier, and 31) Complete painting of the inside and outside of the old dining hall in preparation for the 75th celebrations.

The projects and programs that OMSU-NA has been involved with over the past twenty-four years were very labor intensive, capital intensive, and time-consuming and we thank all those particularly in Ghana for their dedication and hard work in seeing to it that the projects went on smoothly. We also thank all the Mawulians and Sympathizers of Mawuli School, whose dues and donations are making a difference in the rebuilding of the school. OMSU-NA's entire focus has been on revamping and rebuilding Mawuli School as evidenced by the close to \$420,000 that we have spent on the school in these past twenty-four years. As we look forward to the future through reflection and self-introspection as a charitable organization at this Congress, let's all rededicate ourselves to helping Mawuli School overcome its difficulties and challenges as it strives to educate an ever-increasing population of young girls and boys in the face of severe budgetary constraints in Ghana.

Very dear Mawulians and sympathizers and friends of Mawuli School, what I have enumerated above are just the tip of the iceberg as we continue our efforts to rebuild the school to recapture the "Mawuli glory" and reposition it towards its centenary. The tasks confronting us in dealing with the problems of Mawuli are not easy, but we strongly believe that with focus, tenacity of purpose, and unity in action we would be successful. The numbers of active dues-donations-paying members and sympathizers is steadily growing every year and we hope to see increases in the years to come. Without a doubt, the more our numbers grow in this area, the better and easier it becomes to accomplish our declared tasks of rebuilding the school in all areas of endeavor. Therefore, we again invite Mawulians and sympathizers who are yet to become active dues-donations and levy paying members to please do so without any hesitation. It is time for **CONCRETE POSITIVE ACTION** in redressing the problems of Mawuli School and some of us strongly believe that the only group of people that the school can count on in its time of need and distress are its alumni and sympathizers. In this vein, let me take the opportunity at this juncture to commend the OMSU Classes of 1969, 1970, 1976, 1982, 1984, 1986, 1987, 1988, 1990, 1994, 1998, 2006, and any other classes that I've not mentioned for undertaking rehabilitation programs and projects at the school in very recent times. ENDOWMENT FUND

Purpose:

To create a structured, functional, transparent and sustainable fund for physical and human resource development for MAWULI School.

The Fund shall operate as an investment-driven endowment designed to ensure long-term capital preservation and sustainable impact for Mawuli School.

Areas of Coverage:

7. **School Competitions Support:** Provide dedicated support for all school competitions. Special attention must be given to the Science and Mathematics and Sharks quiz competitions.

Funding allocations shall be prioritized annually based on strategic needs assessment in consultation with Mawuli School management.

OMSU CONSTITUTION (REVISED)

Highlights - OMSU Constitution

The following are the highlights of the Constitution, which was adopted on October 28th, 2023, OMSU Congress:

Article 3: Membership

3.1. Membership of OMSU shall consist of members, honorary members, and affiliate members.

3.2. Members

Members shall be all former students of the school who are registered with OMSU or its Groups and Chapters by paying the prescribed annual dues.

3.3. Honorary Members

Honorary members shall be persons who are not under Clause 3.2 but who have made substantial contributions to the progress of the School or OMSU and have been approved by the Executive Council.

3.4. Affiliate Members

Affiliate members shall be current and former staff of the school and other persons who are interested in the development of the School or OMSU and on application to the Executive Council have been admitted as affiliate members.

Article 4: Organization

4.1. OMSU shall be incorporated under the laws of Ghana as a company limited by guarantee. All groups and chapters shall be covered by this incorporation and shall not be incorporated separately.

4.2. OMSU shall be a membership organization.

4.3. There shall be a General Meeting of all members of OMSU which shall be known as Congress, and it shall be the highest decision-making body of OMSU.

4.4. There shall be an Executive Council which shall be responsible to Congress.

4.5. The Executive Council may approve the establishment of Groups and Chapters within OMSU which shall not be incorporated separately.

4.6. Groups may be year groups, house groups or any other group approved by the Executive Council.

4.7. Chapters may be geographically based, tertiary based or any other chapter approved by the Executive Council.

4.8. The following criteria and conditions shall be met by any Group or Chapter:

(a) The Group or Chapter shall be well-formed and functioning.

- (b) The Group or Chapter shall have a recognized leadership.
 - (c) Leadership of the Group or Chapter shall undertake to pay the subscription for the Group or Chapter to OMSU.
 - (d) An application for recognition of a Group or Chapter shall be made to the Executive Council.
 - (e) Each Group or Chapter shall make and adopt bye-laws consistent with this Constitution.
- 4.9. There shall be a Council of Representatives (COR).

Article 11: Council of Representatives (COR)

11.1. There shall be Council of Representatives (hereinafter referred to as COR) comprising the following:

- a) Executive Council; and
- b) President, Secretary and Treasurer of each year Group and Chapter as representatives.

11.2. The COR shall:

- 11.2.1. meet once every quarter;
- 11.2.2. serve as a conduit of communication and exchange of ideas between the Executive Council and the general membership; and
- 11.2.3. serve as a liaison between the Executive Council and the Groups and Chapters.

11.3. In line with Article 12, members of the COR shall be nominated by the Executive Council to fill any vacancy that may occur between one election and the next.
